

Charlie And The Great Glass Elevator Trailer

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THE BUZZ AROUND THE TRAILER FOR CHARLIE AND THE GREAT GLASS ELEVATOR

For generations, readers have delighted in the whimsical world of Roald Dahl, a universe where chocolate rivers flow and giants roam the sky. Among his most beloved creations is *Charlie and the Great Glass Elevator*, the direct sequel to *Charlie and the Chocolate Factory*.
